Courses and roads assessed. LL70E	Course local to: 8.6 miles 2 laps out and back course on B6236 Rossendale, turning at B6231 roundabout

Course description

START on the westbound B6236 at the west side of the red slow sign on the road 100 yards west of the concrete road closed barriers proceed west on B6236 to roundabout junction with B6231 [2.15 miles]. Encircle roundabout and retrace on B6236 to turn at cones 50 m short of finish 4.30 miles and do another circuit to roundabout and FINISH at red slow sign on road 8.60 miles

Traffic flows

Wide B-road course with light traffic, with some stretches of double white lines. Suitable for club events. Local traffic only due to temporary closure to through traffic.

Course event/history

This is a Type B (Club) events emergency course introduced in 2025 to account for a road closure due to a landslip. It uses the same road as LL70 with the same turning point, but with two short laps starting and finishing about half way into LL70. The road has a small number of junctions with minor roads (individually recorded) and multiple junctions with farm/residential/wind farm tracks (not individually recorded).

5		B6236 outbound leg to turn and return leg	Several sections of double white lines, some of which extend for 0.2 miles – risk of vehicles close passing riders.	LOW	Organiser to place a prominent notice at signing-on to ask riders to be mindful of the possibility of vehicles attempting to overtake on the double white lines.
6		Junction right with Cobbs Lane		LOW	Organiser to place cycle event warning signs visible to traffic coming out of Cobbs Lane
7		Cross-road with Red Shell Lane left and Whitecroft Road right		LOW	Organiser to place cycle event warning signs visible to traffic coming out of Whitecroft Road and Red Shell Lane

11	4.30 miles	Turn at cones 50 m short of finish 4.30 miles and complete a 2 nd circuit.	U-turn at the cones. No through traffic.	LOW	Organiser to position 1 marshal at the turn for safety and direction.
12	8.60 miles	FINISH at red slow sign on road.		LOW	Organiser to ensure finish officials are careful to keep well in to the side and not to park their vehicles too near the finish.

NOTES:

1. The use of a vehicle for the timekeeper(s) at start and finish is where appropriate and is only identified as an example for the action to be taken.
2. The small junctions or entrances to farms/facilities (garage, eatery, etc) that are not identified in this risk assessment have been considered, however are not considered significant to pose a risk and therefore have not been noted.
3. All rules of the road must be followed as to 'the Highway Code'.
