- HQ will be opened at 8.30 am and sign on and numbers will be available from 9.00 am.
- Competitors under the age of 18 **must** provide a signed Parental Consent Form at Sign on.
- Competitors must sign off at the HQ after finishing in order to be counted as a finisher.
- There are toilet/change facilities in the HQ.
- Light refreshments will be available in the HQ after your ride.
- Presentations will be made when the Timekeepers have confirmed the results

Parking

There is limited parking at the HQ and in adjacent laybys.

Further parking is available in the laybys near the Bay Horse pub in the village.


Please park considerately in the Village. Stamfordham is used to hosting cycle events and all riders are asked to help maintain the sports cordial relationship with the residents.

Do NOT Park on North and South Side residential roads either side of the village green or on the Green itself There are lay-bys next to the First School THOUGH THESE MAY BE BUSY

Description of Course M12S

Stamfordham - Black Heddon - Ingoe - Matfen - Stamfordham 12

Miles



Start ½ mile north of Stamfordham on the B6309. Proceed north to Black Heddon, and bear left to crossroads Belsay-Wallridge. Turn left to Wallridge, left towards Ingoe, left to Matfen, left to Stamfordham, to Finish at the small lay-by just beyond the Stamfordham sign and at the 20 MPH speed warning.

GENERAL RIDER SAFETY NOTES and INSTRUCTIONS

- Vehicles of competitors / officials / marshals / helpers to be parked safely and without hindrance to other road users.
- Take extra care at road junctions, on descents, and when passing through villages.
- In wet conditions, descents and sharp bends can be particularly hazardous and should be negotiated with extreme care.
- Keep to the left at all times, and especially so on narrow roads with right hand bends.
- No U-turns to be made in the vicinity of the timekeeper.
- No dismounting in the finishing area and riders to proceed carefully into village observing the 20mph speed limit on crossing the finishing line.
- Road surface conditions may change depending on the season, weather or condition
 of the road. It is the riders' responsibility to ride in such a manner that allows them
 to ride safely and with consideration to other road users at all times.
- Head down riding is dangerous.
- It is the responsibility of the rider to check the Risk Assessment on the day to be aware of any extra hazards or changes they should be aware of.
- Every Competitor MUST have, fixed to their machine, both a front and rear facing, working light. These must be clearly visible (Regulation 14). No lights, no ride.
- Every rider MUST wear a helmet that conforms to current Safety Standards (Regulation15) and it is their responsibility to ensure it fits correctly and is in good condition/undamaged.
- You must not take pace or shelter from any other vehicle or competitor (no drafting)
- Failure to comply with the above may lead to disciplinary action being taken
- No warming up on the course once the race has started

Road surface conditions should be taken into consideration by riders:

The course has been subject to considerable improvement in surface quality over the last 2 years. Nevertheless riders should note there is still a section of relatively rough road approaching the farm at Black Heddon (the first marshal point on map) and should exercise due care and attention at all times.
