


STRETFORD WHEELERS CYCLING CLUB Our Centenary Celebration 25

RESULTS OF OPEN 25 MILE TIME TRIAL

Thank you for entering our event. These are trying days for us all, with the ever changing Coronavirus Constaints and the hokey-cokey Lock-Down rules that surround us all, but somehow, as a collective bunch of individuals, you and we have managed to pull this event off.

From a Coronavirus Control point of view, it seemed to go fairly smoothly after we got the venue and the numbers set out. Thanks for your patience, especially those early starters, champing at the bit to get changed and warmed up. Granted, we could polish up some of the procedures and get things a bit smoother (signs to the Toilets, etc) but this was the first attempt for anyone in the district to run a fully open Class A event since Spring. Of course, any feed-back from a participant's point of view (with regard to the Covid measures) would be welcome, both for our club and also to assist other event promoters in the future.

To those of you who had read the instructions and notified me in advance that you would not be able to start, my Reserve Riders are grateful. They all got offered a start by Friday afternoon. Thank-you from me and my Reserves.

You have been made aware that we had an issue with the timing equipment which has affected the times given for five of the first few finishers. This has not affected anyone else's times – the back-up stopwatches system was deployed. However, the Finish Timekeeper apologises most profusely: the initial stopwatch device locked up intermittantly and is unable to recall all the stored split times via either of its output methods. The riders affected have been contacted and we have quoted their ride time based on the time of the next rider crossing the finish line whose time we did correctly record. So, those five riders actually went quicker than quoted on the Results. This is far from satisfactory but has not affected any of the prize allocations and records their participation into the CTT system database.

It was a fast day though, with a favorable north-easterly helping twice through from Chelford to the A50, as reflected by the results, with a new J2/9 Course Record and both M&W Junior Course Records being reset. Adam Duggleby briefly held the Course Record for $4\frac{1}{2}$ minutes until Simon Wilson finished, pipping that!

A small number of you strayed off course: the golden rule is that we always place marshals at key turns on the course.

Traffic was a bit of an issue, at Chelford Roundabout, in Chelford Village (with one car pulling out in front of another and one rider not quite managing to stop quickly enough!) and with farm tractors on the A50. Be aware riders that one marshal was confronted by an irate driver, claiming to have dash-cam footage of "dangerous riding" that may be reported to the Police. We will of course follow up on any enquiry that arises. \odot

Arm Numbers: for those of you who do not use "Nopinz" type arm-band number holders and do not wish to stick pins through expensive skin suits, we have established that masking-tape wrapped right around the upper arm seems to make a viable means of holding the number in place. ©
