Longstone Edge hill climb

Great Longstone – Wednesday 30th June

Promoted by Peak Road Club and myHill Cycling.

After a successful debut last year, 109 racing cyclists from across the country assembled in Great Longstone for the second running of the Longstone Edge hill climb. With an easing of Covid related restrictions the promoters were able to not only base the event in the village, but spectators were also welcomed onto the course, and with the weather playing its part there was a steady stream of supporters heading up from Great Longstone to cheers on the riders. It was wonderful to see so many people enjoying the spectacle against the magnificent back drop.

With the road fully closed and marshals in position, racing got underway at 7.01pm and it was the youngest riders who tackled the hill first. Last years juvenile entry of 15 had increased to 25 this year, and it was 7-year-old Raife Sheehan riding for Sheffield Triathlon Club who got proceedings underway. Resplendent in a polka dot cycling top, Raife made short work of the climb to record a magnificent time of 10 minutes 40 seconds in his first race, but immediately after Raife came another 7-year-old, George Anthony, who astonished the assembled gallery with a time of 9:49. Raife and George, however, only just managed to finish before rider number 3. Olivia Marriott rampaged up the climb to establish a record time for a 9-year-old girl with an extraordinary time of 8:48. A record which will, surely, stand the test of time.

Olivia's time stayed at the top of the leader board until the number 10 rider, Roch Morgan, appeared. Roch rode the event last year, and he used his experience to record an excellent 6:50, but he soon saw his time usurped by the 6:19 achieved by 11-year-old Finley Hudson riding for the heavily represented Matlock Cycling Club. Immediately after Hudson came another Matlock superstar – Maia Howell – who defended her juvenile title with a time of 7:13. This time was a shade slower than the time she set last year when the wind was in a more favourable direction.

With the juvenile event progressing to the last 10 riders, fast times came thick and fast. Harrison Dainty troubled the 6-minute barrier with a time of 6:02, before fellow 13-year-old, Harry Hudson, made sure of it with a magnificent 5:43. The last word, however, went to last rider off and pre-race favourite, Ryan Williams. Ryan came second last year with a time of 5:17. But one year later, and one year stronger, Ryan flashed through the finish line in a scarcely believable time for someone so young. His winning time of 5:02 would have been good enough for 6th place in the senior event and along with many other outstanding performances this year, Ryan Williams is clearly a name to look out for in the future.

With the juvenile event settled, attention now turned to the small, but select, field of 12 senior women. Getting the women underway was 70-year-old Yvonne Twelvetree who, like the proverbial bottle of wine, is getting better with age as she shaved her 2020 time by 4 seconds to establish a V70 record of 9:11. Sonia Insley matched her overall veteran's record of 7:48 she set last year, before Rebekah Smith went to the top of the leader board with 7:27. The day, however, belonged to Becky Hair. Absent from last year's event, Becky recorded a winning time of 6:03 which was too good for Madeline Crosswaite who had to settle for second with 6:49; the only other time under 7 minutes.

With an excellent field of 78 junior, senior and veteran men assembled, much more exciting racing was still to come, and the crowd soon had plenty to cheer about when 60-year-old 'Rapid' Rich Stoodley recorded an excellent time of 6:53 to establish a V60 record.

Callum Spencer from the local 7 Hills CC was the first to breach the 6-minute barrier with a time of 5:23, before Dan Taylor demolished the junior record with 4:52 – the first time a junior rider has recorded a time under 5 minutes. The quality of Taylor's time was proven, as the expected plethora of 4-minute rides did not materialize. Both Alex Whitmore and Laurence Fryer-Taylor crept under 5 minutes with 4:57 and 4:59 respectively, and it wasn't until half an hour after Taylor's excellent effort that one of the pre-race favourites, Leon Wright, went to the top of the leader board with 4:39.

Soon after Wright, came Darrell Clarke who defended his veterans title with 5:14, and the only question that now remained was whether last man off, and previous national champion, Adam Kenway could take the top spot. As usual Kenway put everything into his attempt but his time of 4:56 was only good enough for 3rd place on this occasion. Kenway's time, once again, proving that the lighter wind conditions were generally leading to slower times than the previous year.

With the racing done and the signs cleared away, it was time to reflect on another promotion which owes its success to so many people and organisations. The first thanks must go to **Great Longstone Parish Council** who once again put their full support behind the event. Having a closed road means that there is no age limit for competitors, and it was a wonderful spectacle to see so many youngsters taking part, so thanks go to the **residents of Moor Road** and the **owners of Dale Farm** for supporting the road closure and enabling so many young riders to take part.

The organisers are aware that the event does take place within private land, so many thanks are extended to **Stuart Fairfax** of Longstone Moor Farm for his support. It was wonderful to see an increase in the involvement from the local community, so many thanks to **Jane Stirland, Lauranne Pearce** and their helpers for providing not just one, but two, refreshment stalls. Thanks also to **Jane Littlefield** for allowing us some access to the village hall. Trust me when I say that the competitors were very grateful to have the use of toilets! Can I also extend thanks to **Robert Thornhill** who generously offered one of his paddocks for competitors parking this year; this was a wonderful feature of the event and made life so much easier for the competitors and organisers alike.

Finally, if you are one of the people who walked up the hill to cheer on the competitors, can I pass on my heartfelt thanks. Hill climbing is a tough sport and spectator encouragement really does help! If you did not make it out to the event, and you are wondering what the fuss is all about, we will be back next year. So, pack your picnic bag and blanket, bring some money for the refreshment stall and we will see you on the hill next summer!
