SCCC awards are based on **one rider one prize**. The fastest overall riders (TT or Road) will be awarded the overall prizes irrespective of age category. Awards are in order of priority, e.g. if you are a Vet 50 who wins overall on a road bike then you get the 1st Overall Prize only. This means prizes will be more distributed amongst competitors.

NB For those awards where a 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize are listed: there must be at least one entrant in a gender or bike category for first prize to be offered, three entrants for a first and second prize and 5 entrants for a 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize to be offered.

In addition to this: as part of the SVTTA championship, we will also award the fastest SVTTA rider overall, fastest SVTTA rider based on handicap and the lantern rouge SVTTA rider. Medals for the Scottish District 25 Championship will also be awarded.

“Glasgow St. Christopher’s Wheelers” was formed on the 14th April 1935. Willie Rafferty was a founding member and in whose memory the trophy is named. In 1982 the club title was changed and the St. Christophers Cycling Club continues based in East Kilbride.



The club now have 30 active members and regularly organise Social Rides on Thursday Nights and Sunday mornings as well as hosting the 10m TT Jack Robertson Auldhouse League on a Tuesday evening. The club normally run 2 Open events annually via the CTT

The Course

Event HQ

Event HQ: Bishopton Community Hall, Gledstane Rd, Bishopton, PA7 5AU

Event Sign-On: from 7:00 am

Event Organiser: Vincent Pickering

Notes for Competitors and Local Regulations

1. Sign on will be open from 7:00 am in the Bishopton Hall
2. Please read the enclosed anti-doping notice
3. Please make sure you know the course, this is **YOUR** responsibility take special note
 - a. Where the Finish is – it is not the same as the 10 mile course
 - b. That there is a dead turn which you will navigate twice
 - c. If you miss the off slip at the Westferry roundabout you will end up on the M8 – please don't!
4. Under 18s must complete a parental consent form (this can be downloaded from the CTT site) and hand it in at sign on. No form = No ride.
5. The distance from Race HQ is approximately 2 miles, please allow plenty of time to reach the start area before your allocated time.
6. Course Marshals have no legal authority to stop traffic on the course, and as such will only provide course directional information.
7. Limited shower facilities are available at Race HQ, beyond the kitchen area - although these may be seconded for any anti-doping controls.
8. All presentation awards will be at the end of the event.
9. Once a rider has completed their ride, they must return their race number and sign out, failure to do either will result in a DNF
10. Riders **MUST** have both FRONT and REAR lights affixed to their bike, both must be visible and working.
11. Riders **MUST** not wear dark coloured clothing.
12. Riders **MUST** not ride with their head down at any point
13. Riders **MUST** ensure their bicycle is mechanically fit-for-purpose (steering; brakes; drive-train; contact points etc).
14. Riders **MUST NOT change lanes at any point on the course** except where maneuvering safely into the outside lane for the turn at the Newark roundabout. **Any other crossing of the central white line will be an automatic disqualification.**
15. Riders **MUST** adhere to the rules and regulations of the Highway. Marshals and Police will be monitoring riding standards.
16. Any rider that is reported for breach of any of the above **WILL** incur sanctions - this may include disqualification.

Doping Control

This event may be subject to a Doping Control It is your responsibility to check.

As soon as you have finished you should return to the event HQ as it is your responsibility to check if you are required for Doping Control.

Race numbers required for Doping Control will be displayed at the HQ adjacent to the result board If your number is displayed you should report immediately to Doping Control which will be nearby.

Remember, it is up to you to check and ensure that you comply If required you must report to Doping Control after finishing without delay.



Course Details


Course Details: Westferry WW25/01

1. Race HQ is in the Bishopton Community Hall: The distance from Race HQ to the start is approximately 2 miles, please allow plenty of time to reach the start area before your allocated time.



2. Start on Greenock Rd approx. halfway between the roundabout junction with Slateford Road and the Railway bridge - heading West
3. Immediate LEFT on slip-road to A8 at Westferry roundabout
4. Proceed westbound on A8
5. Straight through first roundabout at Langbank

6. Take 1st exit at second roundabout at Woodhall onto Glasgow Road and proceed to dead turn
7. At the dead turn (see image below) retrace route back to Woodhall and take the first exit back onto Greenock Road



8. Continue on A8 to TURN at Newark Roundabout... PLEASE OBSERVE EXTREME CAUTION
9. Retrace to Westferry roundabout and turn and repeat
10. At the end of the second lap note that the Finish(see image below) is ***under the railway bridge on Greenock Rd***
IT IS NOT ON THE SLIPROAD (the slip finish is used for the 10 mile course only)
