Proceed south west along A53 to Espley Island	3.22 miles
Turn left, taking the 1st exit onto A442 and proceed South to Shawbirch Island	12.63 miles
Encircle the Island taking the 4th exit onto A442 north to Espley Island	22.07 miles
Turn right taking the 3 <sup>rd</sup> exit onto A53 Hodnet bypass and proceed to	
T junction signed ' Lostford Fauls Green ' ( Old A53 )	24.97 miles
Turn left onto old A53 and proceed to finish on bridge over Bailey Brook	25.11 miles
