Note: Start is about 6 miles from Race HQ – see map for details.

Start at a paint mark about 25 yards short of the expansion joint in the road surface of the bridge where St Neots Road crosses over A428 dual carriageway just west of Highfields Caldecote.

Proceed eastwards straight over (1st exit) Caldecote RAB to Hardwick RAB where sharp left, 1st exit, onto A428 westbound.

Pass Cambourne junction to TURN (5.4 miles) at Caxton Gibbet RAB and retrace A428 eastbound passing Cambourne and Hardwick junctions to exit at slip to Madingley RAB (signed Cambridge)

NOTE: NO MARSHAL HERE but THERE WILL BE CTT ARROWS.

At the roundabout take 4th exit to A428 westbound. Continue past Hardwick and

Cambourne junctions to TURN (18.0 miles) at Caxton Gibbet RAB, then repeat via Madingley RAB onto third lap to TURN (30.6 miles) at Caxton Gibbet RAB, then repeat via Madingley RAB onto fourth lap to TURN (43.2 miles) at Caxton Gibbet RAB,

Then return to Madingley RAB, but **TAKE THE 3rd EXIT** (the one before the A428 slip) onto St Neots Road to **FINISH** 0.6 miles along St Neots Road 20 yds after Hardwick 40mph sign.

IMPORTANT: Note that 4th time at Madingley roundabout, when you will have done over 49 miles, you leave earlier to go to the finish. There will be a yellow sign at the relevant point showing the laps/finish routes.

Prizes

The fastest overall open and female riders will be jointly awarded the Shaftesbury Centenary Trophy.

Awards will be presented after the event has concluded. If award winners are unable to attend, the organiser will contact you after the event to arrange payment of prizes.

1st place riders in open and female categories are kindly asked to wait at HQ to allow a photograph with the winners trophy.

Course Risk Assessment & Rider Notes

Please remember marshals are stationed at junctions for your safety but they are not responsible for directing traffic or indicating if the junction is clear.

Riders are reminded that no competitor shall be allowed to start an event unless they are wearing a **HARD SHELL SAFETY HELMET** that meets an internationally accepted safety standard.

Riders are also reminded that no competitor shall be allowed to start an event unless such competitor has affixed to the rear of their machine a working rear red light and affixed to the front of their machine a working front white light; lights to be illuminated, either flashing or constant, and in a position that is clearly visible to other road users.

Competitors must observe mandatory traffic signs and have no right of way over other traffic using the road. All Road Traffic Legislation applies.

No riding with your head down – any rider observed riding dangerously will be disqualified from the event and reported to the CTT District Committee for further disciplinary action.

Riders are reminded that dropping litter, (such as energy gel wrappers or banana skins) is a criminal offence and offenders will be liable to disciplinary action.

NO U TURNS are allowed within sight of either the start or the finishing points. Riders carrying out this dangerous manoeuvre are liable for disqualification from the event.

Local regulation: Static trainers are banned from morning events in London East district. So please warm up on local roads.

Road Bike Rules

Please note that for the 2024 season the rules regarding helmet choice for the road bike category have changed. To qualify for the road bike category you must not wear a helmet that covers the ears.

Full road bike regulations printed below for your reference.

- 29. Road Bike Criteria (Moved from Regulation 14, 14l Section: Competitors)
- (a) The road bike can possess drop or straight handlebars; no tri-bars, clip-on bars or Spinaci bars are allowed; no disc wheels; both front & rear wheels must have at least 12 spokes each; the maximum rim depth allowed is 90mm.
- (b) Helmets used in Road Bike category events must not cover the ears or have a teardrop/pointy style "tail", any helmet vents must not be covered or blocked. The helmet must not have been altered or had any element added or removed in terms of design or form but may be used as the manufacturer intended (e.g., sliding vents). It is prohibited to add a detachable cover to a helmet. The composition of the helmet material and its surface condition are not subject to any regulations. However, additions to the helmet are not allowed (cover, tape etc.).
- N.B. For competitors riding Road Bikes, competitors must predominantly ride holding the drops or brake hoods. Riders may not ride in the "Puppy Paws" Position or simulate a Tri-Bar position by resting the forearms on the handlebars.



Conveniently located just 2km from the M11 and 9km from the start, we have chosen the Barton Sports & Social Pavillion to host our event this year. Changing: The HQ has large and separate changing facilities for men & women.

Sign In / Out

All competitors must sign in at HQ and collect their number. Once finished you must return your number to HQ and sign out. If you do not sign out you will be disqualified.

Getting to the Start

Please leave plenty of time to get to the start line, there is ample parking near the start if you'd prefer to drive. However, please do not park too close to the start line and be considerate of other road users. Please note that there will not be any direction arrows to guide you to the start, please ensure you are familiar with the route!

Signing Out / Post Race:

Please remember to sign out and return your number, failing to do so will result in disqualification.

Tea & Coffee will be available upon your return. Most importantly there will be a fabulous selection of cakes available for purchase at just £2.00, cash and card accepted!

A real time results board will be available in HQ showing results as riders cross the line as well as split times recorded at Madingley RAB. Please note that times displayed are provisional, official times will be reported once ratified by the timekeepers. The timing system is a collaboration between The Shaftesbury and HCS Technologies Ltd. The system will be available for general use soon under the banner of TimeTrialHQ.com. Handicapping by Spindata (www.spindata.co.uk)

Spindata is a system for ranking time trial results across the UK by using time and relative position to others. Spindata has been developed to recognise the achievements of all riders, whatever their ability. The Spindata algorithm generates a predicted time for an event using a rider's past riding history, course and weather conditions. This predicted time will be used as your handicap for the event. If you have not ridden sufficient events to generate a predicted time, you will not be eligible to compete in the handicap category. Predicted times will be published on Wednesday 17th April.
